A. IF R REPLIES THAT THEY ARE BOTH <u>FRUIT</u> , SAY, " Good ," WRITE DOWN THE ANSWER, AND PROCEED TO THE NEXT ITEM.					
B. IF R GIVES A CORRECT, BUT CONCRETE ANSWER, LIKE "YOU EAT THEM BOTH", WRITE IT DOWN BUT SAY, That's right, you do (eat them both). Also, they are <u>both fruit</u>." THEN GO ON TO THE NEXT ITEMS.					
C. IF R FAILS TO RESPOND TO L5a OR GIVES AN INCORRECT ANSWR, SAY "They are both fruit; you eat them both." AND GO ON TO THE NEXT ITEMS.					
D. DO NOT PROBE "DON'T KNOW" RESPONSES.					
GIVE NO FURTHER HELP ON SUBSEQUENT ITEMS. HOWEVER, IF A RESPONSE IS UNCLEAR OR AMBIGUOUS, YOU MAY SAY, "What do you mean?" OR "Tell me a little more." RECORD R'S ANSWER VERBATIM FOR EACH ITEM.
